Alex: I'll take those tomatoes and these carrots. That should be all for today.

Taylor: Perfect! Let me pack these up for you. That will be \$12 in total.

Singular (one item)

THIS = near me

Example: This apple is fresh.



THAT = far from me

Example: That orange is on the shelf.



Plural (more than one item)

THESE = near me

Example: These bananas are cheap.



THOSE = far from me

Example: Those grapes look good.



This	1 (singular)	Near	<i>This tomato is red.</i>
That	1 (singular)	Far	<i>That apple is green.</i>
These	Many (plural)	Near	<i>These carrots are fresh.</i>
Those	Many (plural)	Far	<i>Those potatoes are big.</i>
