Present Perfect with *ever*, *never*, *just*, *already* and *yet*

Have you *ever tried* beans on toast?

Yes, I *have*./No, I *haven't*. I've *never tried* it.

Bea's *just got up*.

We've *already eaten*.

She *hasn't woken up yet*.

Have you *finished yet*? Yes, I *have*./No, I *haven't*.
