


# Different types of refrigerators

1. Large, insulated rooms that are assembled on-site, allowing staff to physically walk into them for storage.
2. The classic, traditional style refrigerator where the freezer compartment is positioned above the larger fresh-food section.
3. Features two vertical compartments split down the middle, with the freezer on one side and the refrigerator on the other, both spanning the full height.
4. Designed to sit flush with your kitchen cabinetry for a built-in look, regardless of the door style.
5. Has two doors for the refrigerator compartment and a pull-out freezer drawer below.
6. The reverse of the top-freezer, with the main refrigerator compartment on top and the freezer below, often as a pull-out drawer.
7. Units with glass doors or open fronts used in supermarkets and delis to showcase products.
8. Units designed only for fresh food storage, often paired with a separate freezer.
9. High power systems designed to rapidly freeze large quantities of food (e.g. meat, fish) at extremely low temperatures (often -30 °C or colder) to preserve quality.
10. Huge, custom-built facilities designed to store goods in bulk.
