A. TIPS

✅ Step 1: Underline Keywords (Gạch chân từ khóa)

Mục tiêu: Giúp tập trung vào thông tin quan trọng khi nghe.

Cách làm:

- Gạch chân danh từ, động từ, tính từ mô tả – đó là từ khóa chính.
- Từ khóa giúp bạn biết cần nghe gì và so sánh thông tin nhanh hơn.

💡 Tip: Đừng gạch chân mọi từ – chỉ chọn những từ “chứa thông tin”!

⚠️ Step 2: Watch Out for Traps (Tránh bẫy)

Mục tiêu: Tránh bị “bẫy” khi nghe.

Cách làm:

- Đề thường “gài” từ giống nhau giữa bài nghe và đáp án.
- Nghe ngữ cảnh, không chọn chỉ vì “nghe thấy từ đó”!

🎧 Ví dụ:

Question:

What sport does the girl want to try next week?

A. Tennis B. Basketball C. Swimming

Transcript:

Boy: Did you enjoy your swimming class yesterday?

Girl: Yes, but I've been doing that every week. I want to try something different now.

Boy: Like what?

Girl: Tennis sounds exciting!

👉 Đáp án: A. Tennis

💡 Vì sao?

“Swimming” được nhắc đến nhưng cô bé đã học rồi, không phải “muốn thử”.

“Tennis” là môn cô bé muốn thử tuần sau → A. Tennis.
