


Counting by the Dozen



Introduction

In this activity, you will learn all about a dozen. A dozen means a group of twelve things. You will count items in groups of twelve. You will also practice using the word "dozen" in different ways.

- Group: A number of things that are together.
 - Example: A group of friends plays together.
- Count: To say numbers in order when adding up items.
 - Example: Let's count the apples: one, two, three.
- Dozen: A group of twelve items.
 - Example: A dozen eggs means twelve eggs.
