Our youth club is one place **where I like to relax**.

Non-defining relative clauses (extra information)

Mr Kipling, **who was my first teacher**, was the most helpful.

We Will Rock You, **which is my dad's favourite**, is in my head.

Iceland, **where there are loads of volcanoes**, is a place I'd love to visit.
