Artificial Intelligence (AI) refers to the capability of computers to think and learn in ways similar to humans. AI is already a part of our daily lives; examples include Siri on the iPhone, Netflix recommendations, and Google Maps. Imagine if AI could also write news articles, author books, or even create artwork. In 2018, a painting generated by AI was sold for \$432,000.

Some individuals believe that AI will prove extremely valuable in the future. For instance, AI might help discover innovative solutions to climate change, assist doctors in making improved treatment choices, and generally make life more convenient. It could take on tasks such as cleaning homes or preparing meals.

However, not everyone views AI positively. Some people are concerned that AI could become more powerful than humans and possibly take control. There are also worries about AI replacing human jobs, as robots may be capable of performing most work in the future. According to a study from Oxford University, 47% of jobs in America could be automated by robots within the next two decades.

Others criticize AI for lacking creativity and emotion. They argue that, because AI does not possess feelings, it cannot truly appreciate or produce art or music; only humans can create things that are meaningful and beautiful.

Given these perspectives, the question arises: Should we fear AI or stop using it? AI is already intertwined with our everyday routines, and returning to a world without it is not possible. However, it is important to use AI responsibly, carefully considering its applications and remembering that human beings remain more significant than machines.
