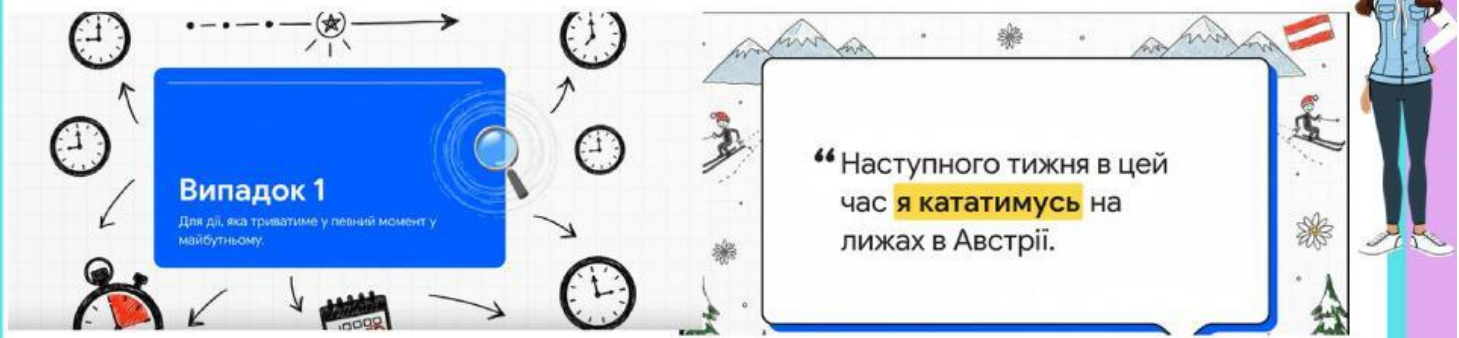

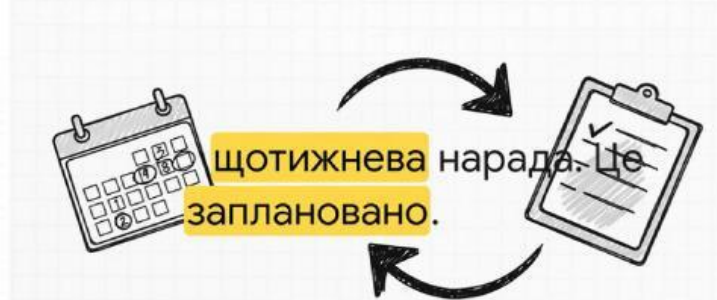
The Future Continuous is used:



This time next week, I'll be skiing in Austria.

for an action which will be in progress at a stated future time.

для дії, яка триватиме у певний момент у майбутньому.



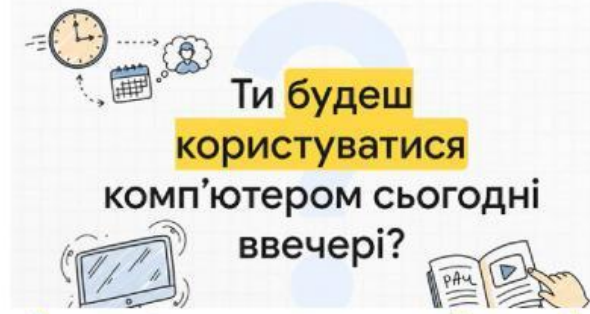
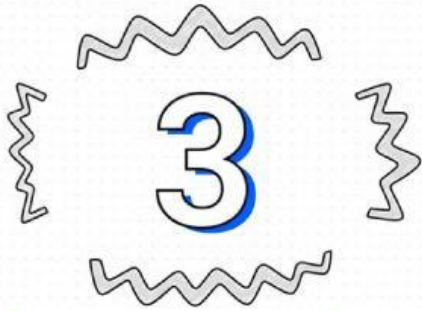
for an action which will definitely happen in the future as the result of a routine or arrangement.

для дії, яка точно відбудеться у майбутньому як результат плану, розкладу або домовленості.

Ні, я зроблю це. Я все одно зустрічатимусь з ними на нараді.

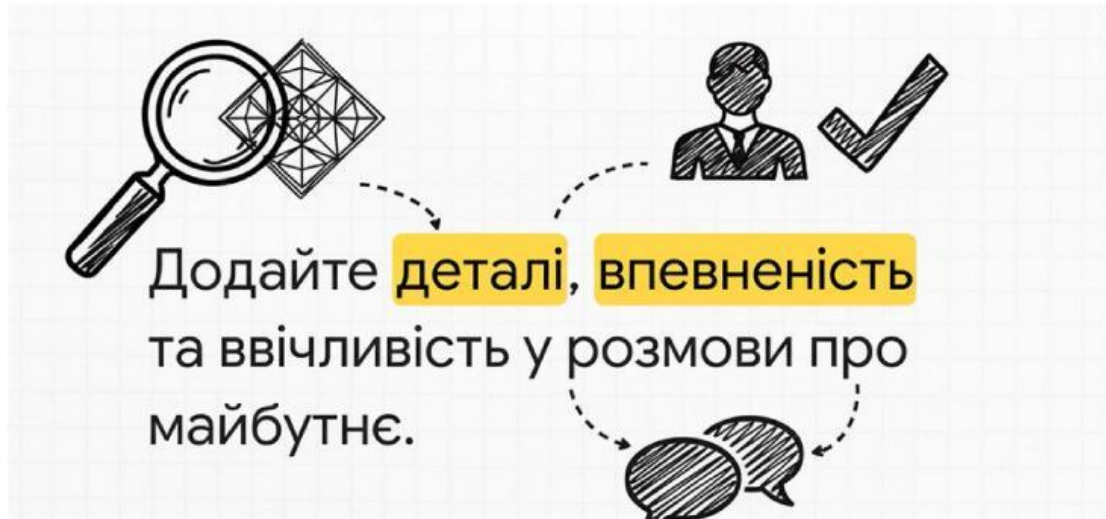
(They have a meeting every week. It's already planned.)
