1. In the first nine months of 2025, Hanoi created jobs for nearly 179,000 people, exceeding the city's yearly target by 5.84%. This was a 0.07% increase compared to the same period last year, according to the Department of Home Affairs (DoHA). The total number of jobs included those funded by the city's budget through the Vietnam Bank for Social Policies (VBSP), which provided 3.76 trillion VND (142.6 million USD) for 45,278 positions.

2. In addition, 19,859 individuals found jobs through job consulting services, job fairs, and the city's employment service center. Another 3,052 workers secured overseas positions, while 110,686 people were employed through other channels. In September alone, Hanoi generated 19,016 new jobs, including 2,254 jobs funded by 219 billion VND in VBSP capital. The rest of the new jobs were created through job fairs, overseas labor programs, and other efforts.

3. During September, the Hanoi Employment Service Center organized 19 job fairs, involving 557 companies and 4,040 job seekers. This led to 2,755 interviews and 975 successful hires. Alongside these efforts, the DoHA approved unemployment insurance for 44,948 workers, amounting to more than 1.58 trillion VND. It also provided job counseling and placement services for 30,013 people and offered vocational training for 710 individuals.

4. These positive results are due to the city's labor market support measures, which include five action plans aimed at employment creation, market development, and occupational safety in 2025. The DoHA also worked to improve labor supply-demand matching and simplify work permit processes for foreign workers, helping attract skilled professionals to meet the city's growing needs. The department issued 8,009 work permits for foreign workers from January to September.
