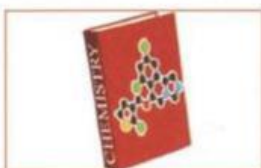


- What does the speaker say about the members of the audience?

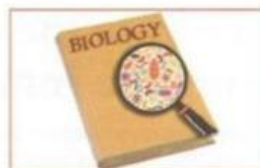
