Fact

A fact is true for everyone. You can check it.

Example: The sun is a star.

Opinion

An opinion is what someone thinks or feels. Other people may not agree.

Example: Ice cream is delicious.

Assumption

An assumption is something you think is true, but you don't actually know. There is no evidence in the sentence.

Example: She is tired. (We do not know. We are guessing.)
