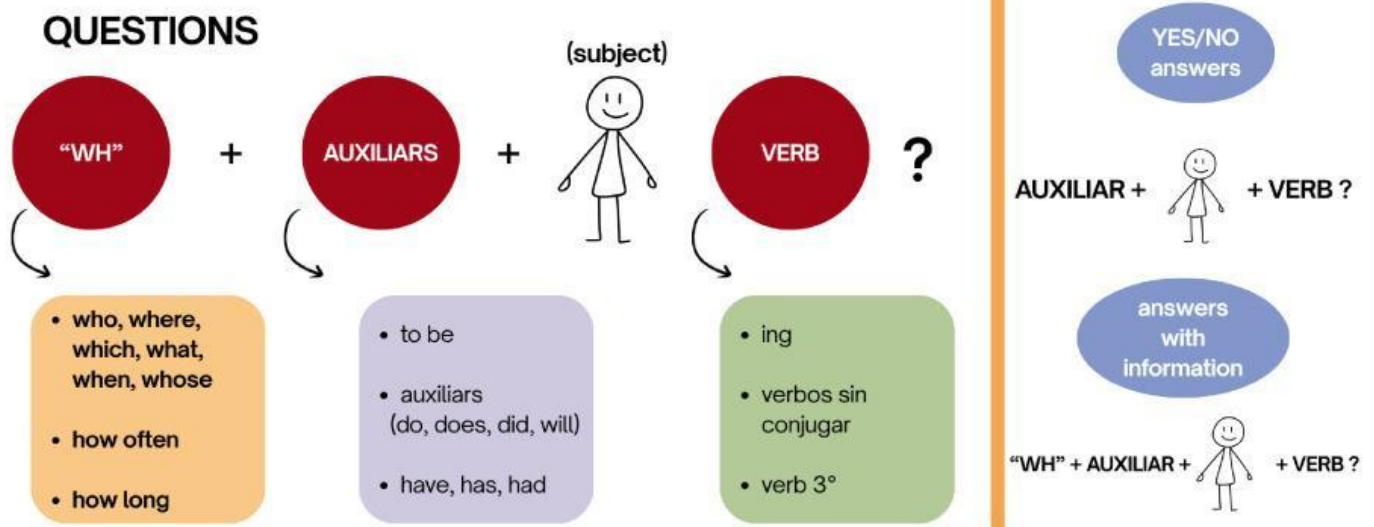

And the painter who had to paint my study three days ago, did not enjoy his job: he left my house and did not paint the door! I imagine both men have done the same job for too long.
