In today's connected world, multiculturalism is more common as people from different cultures live and work together. This gives people access to more cultural experiences and promotes understanding and tolerance (Banks, 2015). While multiculturalism offers many benefits, it also brings challenges that must be managed to create a peaceful society (Parekh, 2000).

One major benefit of multiculturalism is how it **enriches** society with different ideas. For example, many Asian students travel to European countries like Germany, the UK, and Spain. **Their** luggage often carries their homeland viewpoints and values, helping cultures connect. In workplaces, diverse perspectives boost creativity and improve problem-solving. Experiencing different cultures also helps people become more accepting, reducing discrimination and promoting **unity**.

A multicultural society also faces challenges. Language barriers can make communication difficult, leading to misunderstandings or conflicts. Furthermore, people may feel divided by their cultural identities, which can create a sense of "us versus them". Some argue that without efforts to bridge cultural differences, multiculturalism could lead to social fragmentation (Modood, 2007).

Building a successful multicultural society requires inclusive policies and open dialogue. Schools and workplaces can celebrate diversity and teach cultural understanding. **When people actively engage with different cultures, they are more likely to find common ground, develop mutual respect, and contribute to a more united community.**

The housing crisis is global. What are other countries doing about it? Australia is not the only country facing a housing crisis. [A]. Alan Kohler takes us on a whistle-stop tour of five governments trying to make homes more affordable.

Singapore has long been praised for its successful public housing program, with over 80% of its **residents** living in government-built apartments known as HDB flats. These homes are affordable, well-maintained, and come with modern amenities. Buyers can get subsidies to make ownership easier, while strict regulations help keep housing prices under control. [B].

In Canada, housing affordability remains a challenge, particularly in cities like Toronto and Vancouver. High demand and limited supply have caused prices to increase suddenly. [C]. While the government has introduced foreign buyer taxes and incentives for **affordable** housing projects, these initiatives have had limited success so far due to underlying economic pressures and urban migration.

Meanwhile, in Germany, renting is a far more common practice than owning. Rent controls and tenant-friendly policies ensure that rental prices remain **stable**, even in major cities like Berlin. [D]. This approach has made renting an appealing long-term option for many Germans.
