A (Canadian) territory created for the exclusive use of a First Nations community.

The first people to have lived in a territory and who still live there today.

A demand made to the the government regarding the right to own and develop a territory autonomously.

The component of a society that includes art, language, writing, religion. etc.

A Native peoples (First Nations Community) that elects its own council.

People who share the same origin, history, and culture.

The number of births for every 1000 people in a year.

The rights of Native Peoples resulting from their customs.

A type (layer) of permanently frozen ground (soil,rock, sediment)

A vast, cold, flat, treeless Arctic region (of Europe, Asia, and North America) with low growing vegetation, little precipitation and permanently frozen subsoil.

A region of Quebec located north of the 55th parallel and home to all of Quebec's Inuit villages.

A nation's right to establish its own economic, cultural and social rules.

An agreement between two or more people regarding a set of accepted rules.

A line (latitude) beyond which trees do not grow.
