Underlining Conjunctive Adverbs Worksheet

A conjunctive adverb is an adverb that connects two independent clauses. Conjunctive adverbs show cause and effect, sequence, contrast, comparison, or other relationships.

Common conjunctive adverbs include: additionally, as a result, contrarily, consequently, nevertheless, moreover, therefore, thus etc...
