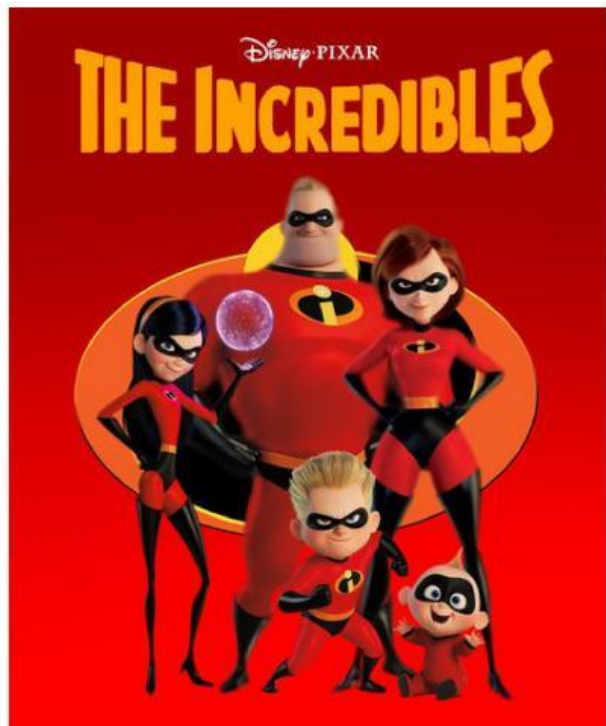

IMPERATIVE

Gives a command, instruction, or request

Sit down, please.

Open the window.

Listen carefully.

EXCLAMATORY

Expresses strong emotion or surprise
