

Indirect Questions

Indirect questions are more **polite ways to ask for information**. We usually use them after expressions like Do you know...? or Could you tell me...?



Important rules

- Use subject + verb order (**NOT** question order)
- Do **NOT** use do / does / did
- No question mark if the sentence starts as a statement

Common expressions

- Do you know...?
- Could you tell me...?
- Can you tell me...?
- Do you have any idea...?
- I'd like to know...?
- Do you remember...?

Examples

Where is the nearest ATM? → **could you tell me where the nearest ATM is?**

What time does the bookstore open? → **Do you know what time the bookstore opens?**
