AFIRMATIVA

Sujeto + auxiliar **HAVE-HAS** +
verbo pasado participio + complemento



- I **have eaten** lobster.
Yo **he comido** langosta.

- She **has eaten** lobster.
Ella **ha comido** langosta.

NEGATIVA

Sujeto + auxiliar **HAVEN'T-HASN'T** +
verbo pasado participio + complemento



- I **haven't eaten** lobster.
Yo **no he comido** langosta.

- She **hasn't eaten** lobster.
Ella **no ha comido** langosta.

INTERROGATIVA

Auxiliar **HAVE-HAS** + sujeto +
verbo pasado participio + complemento?



- **Have** you **eaten** lobster?
¿**Has comido** langosta?
= Yes, I **have**. = No, I **haven't**.

- **Has** she **eaten** lobster?
¿**Ella ha comido** langosta?
= Yes, she **has**. = No, she **hasn't**.
