The Lives of Teenagers

How ¹ teenagers spend their free time? We asked 1,000 teenagers to answer some questions for us, such as: 'What do you do after school?', 'How much homework do you have?', and 'What ² do you go to bed?' Here are some of the most surprising things we learned:

- Teenagers do lots of after-school activities. They do sports, study music, and go to clubs. And because they are busy with these activities, they do ³ often meet up with their friends after school. For example, James Morris from Bristol says he ⁴ goes out to meet his friends on a weekday. He can only meet them at the weekend.
- Teenagers do a lot of homework. Most teenagers study for about two hours ⁵, but some study for three or four hours. For example, Lucy Potter from Aberdeen tells us that she ⁶ does her homework for three hours in the evening.
- Teenagers use screens a lot. At school, they look at computers and televisions all day. On the bus, they ⁷. At home, they use computers and tablets for their homework. In fact, most teenagers look at screens for more than six hours per day. Some people think this is why lots of teenagers ⁸.
- Teenagers ⁹ late. Doctors say that teenagers need eight to ten hours of rest per night, but more than 72% of secondary school students sleep less than seven hours a night. This means that they are often tired at school.
- So, it seems teenagers today ¹⁰ very busy people. Is this a good thing or a bad thing? Tell me below in the comments.
