Diwali, Festival of Lights

Diwali, also known as the festival of lights, is one of the most widely celebrated festivals in India and around the world. It is one of the most significant festivals for followers of the Hindu religion. (1) _____ The exact dates vary each year since the festival is decided according to the Hindu lunar calendar. It is a time of joy, happiness, and togetherness, as families and communities come together to celebrate.

Diwali is also known as Dipawali. Its name comes from the words *avai* (row) and *deepa* (clay lamps). Hindus hang these clay lamps in rows outside their homes as a symbol of their inner light, which protects them from dark spirits.

(2) _____ Different regions of India celebrate Diwali as a way of remembering different gods' battles against demons. However, all the stories celebrate good over evil.

Diwali is a five-day festival, and each day holds its own significance and meaning. On the day, people buy gold, silver, and other items of wealth to bring good fortune into their lives. Many people clean their homes on this day in preparation for the other celebrations to come.



(3) _____ People create patterns on the floor using coloured powder or sand. These patterns are called *rangoli*, and they are designed to welcome the Hindu gods into the house.

The third day is also the main day of the festival. People say a prayer to the Goddess Lakshmi, who is believed to give wealth and good fortune.

(4) _____ There is often an assortment of traditional sweet treats on offer, and the whole family gathers to share them together. (5) _____ The fourth day of the festival is also the first day of the new year. This is the time to visit friends and other relatives and to give presents and good wishes for the year to come. (6) _____ On this day, brothers visit their married sisters so the sisters can pray for them before they can share a meal.
