

LIKES AND DISLIKES – Movies, TV Programs & Music

We can use these verbs to talk about entertainment:

- like
- love
- enjoy
- prefer
- hate
- don't like
- don't enjoy
- don't love
- really like
- can't stand

Examples:

- I **like** movies.
- She **loves** music.
- They **enjoy** TV programs.
- I **don't like** horror movies.
- He **doesn't like** reality shows.

Note: Remember to add -s to the verb for the third person (he / she / it) in affirmative sentences, and use doesn't in negative sentences.

Giving reasons: we can use **Object Pronouns** for giving information about likes and dislikes

Examples:

- My friend likes **horror movies** BUT I don't like **THEM** because I get scared.
- Sara loves **pop music** AND I love **IT** too

	R&B Smooth vocals, emotional delivery, and modern beats.		Salsa Fast-paced Latin dance music with strong percussion.
	Hip Hop Rhythmic rhyming (rapping) over beat-heavy tracks.		Classical Orchestral music from historical periods like Baroque.
	Metal Aggressive sound, distorted guitars, and powerful drumming.		Indie Independent music, unique sounds, and creative freedom.

Situation comedies with recurring characters and humorous plots.



Documentaries

Factual films exploring real people, events, and topics.



Series

Long-form narratives told over multiple episodes and seasons.



Reality Shows

Unscripted programs following real people in various situations.



Comedies

Programs designed to be funny and entertain.



Cartoons

Animated shows for children and adults.



News

Current events, reports, and analysis of world affairs.



Game Shows

Contests with reotility, and commands.



Game Shows

Contests with puzzles, quizzes, and prizes.



Soap Operas

Melodramatic serials with emotional storylines.
