Domestic and family violence has short and long-term physical, emotional, psychological, financial and other effects on women.

The obvious physical effects of domestic and family violence on women are physical injury and death. Yet there are also other effects on women's physical health - such as physical **exhaustion**, and reproductive health problems - that are not necessarily the result of physical injuries.

Women experiencing domestic and family violence are more likely to experience depression, anxiety and sleeping disorders. They have higher stress levels and are at greater risk of suicide attempts. They are at increased risk of misusing alcohol and other drugs.

Women who experience domestic and family violence are often unable to make their own choices because of fear and intimidation. They often live in fear of further violence. They are frequently silenced and unable to express their point of view or experience.

Women who experience domestic and family violence often experience social isolation, including from their own extended family. Isolation can be a form of controlling behaviour or a consequence of women's stress, anxiety, shame, physical injuries and fear.

Seeing the effects of violence on their children can be worrying for women. They may feel or be unable to protect their children; this can have serious effects on their identity and confidence as mothers. Women's ability to parent their children can be affected by the physical, emotional and cognitive effects of **their** own experiences of the violence, and by men's attempts to undermine their confidence and ability as mothers.
