

Evaluations and Comparisons of places

We use different structures to evaluate (give opinions) and compare houses and apartments.

1. Evaluations with adjectives

Structure:

- **not + adjective + enough** = Our apartment **isn't big enough** for our family.
- **too + adjective** = This apartment **is too hot**.

2. Evaluations with nouns

Structure:

- **not enough + noun** = There **aren't enough windows**.
- **too much / too many + noun** = The neighbors make **too much noise**.

3. Comparisons with adjectives

Structure:

- **not as + adjective + as**: The building **isn't as quiet as** our old one.
- **just as + adjective + as**: The location **is just as convenient as** the old one.

4. Comparisons with nouns

Structure:

- **as many + countable noun + as** = We **don't have as many bedrooms as** we used to.
- **as much + uncountable noun + as** = We have **as much privacy as** we used to.
