


TOPIC: Maps & Globes

- **Geography** is the study of the Earth's surface.
- **Cartography** is the art of making maps.
- Persons who draw/make maps to scale are known as **Cartographers**.
- **A map**: A plan/blueprint of the Earth as seen from above.
- **A globe**: A round model of the Earth.

The main features found on a map

- **The title**: Describes the theme or subject of the map. Tell you what the map is about.
- **A border**: Shows where the map ends.
- **An inset**: A smaller map inside a larger one.
- **A compass rose**: A tool that shows direction on a map.
- **A scale**: Helps you to measure distances on a map.
- **The map key or legend**: Shows the symbols on a map and their meanings. Eg. Colours are used as symbols and the map key will display the meaning of each colour.

TOPIC: Earth's Hemisphere


- **A hemisphere:** Half of a sphere. A hemisphere divides the Earth into two equal halves.

Equator

- **The Equator:** An imaginary line that divides the Earth into two halves (the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere)
- The equator measures 0° and runs East to West.


Prime Meridian

- **Prime Meridian:** An imaginary line that divides the Earth into the Western Hemisphere and Eastern Hemisphere.
- The Prime Meridian is located at 0° and runs from the North Pole to South Pole.
- Prime Meridian also known as the Greenwich Meridian.



What is the International Date Line?

- The International Date Line divides the Earth into 24 different time zones.
- It is an imaginary line near the 180° meridian where the calendar date changes by one day (traveling east means going back a day, and traveling west means moving forward a day).
- The line zigzags to avoid splitting countries and islands into different dates.
