

Passive Voice in the Past



What is the passive voice?

We use the passive voice when we want to focus **on the action or the result**, not on who does the action.

Active: The focus is **on the person or thing** that does the action.

Passive: The focus **is on the action or on the object** that receives the action.

Example:

Active: The Disney brothers **founded** the company in 1923.

Passive: The company **was founded** in 1923 by **the Disney brothers**

- **Structure:** To form the passive voice in the past, we use:


was / were + past participle

Examples:

The park **was opened** in 1955.

The letters **were sent** yesterday.

- **Using "by" in the passive**




We use **by** when we want to say who did the action. If the person is not important or is obvious, we can omit it.

Examples:

The opening **was broadcast by** ABC.

The song **was written** in 2010 **by** Jhon.

The thief **was arrested by** the police officer
