- 1 I wasn't hungry, so I didn't eat anything.  
If I'd been hungry, I would have eaten something.
- 2 The accident happened because the road was icy.  
If the road wasn't icy, the accident wouldn't have happened.
- 3 I didn't know that you had to get up early, so I didn't wake you up.  
If I knew, I would have woken you up.
- 4 Unfortunately I lost my phone, so I couldn't call you.  
If I hadn't lost my phone, I would have called you.
- 5 Karen wasn't injured in the crash, because fortunately she was wearing a seat belt.  
If she hadn't been wearing a seat belt, she would have been injured.
- 6 You didn't have any breakfast – that's why you're hungry now.  
If I had breakfast, I wouldn't be hungry now.
- 7 I didn't get a taxi because I didn't have enough money.  
If I had more money, I would have got a taxi.
- 8 Dan didn't do well at school, so he couldn't go to university.  
If Dan had studied harder, he would have done better at school.
