● EXERCISE 109 - JOINING SENTENCES WITH 'WHO' / 'WHICH'

Join these pairs of sentences using 'who' or 'which'. You must leave out the words in bold.

e.g. I know the man. **The man** lives next door to you.

I know the man **who** lives next door to you.

1. This is the girl. **The girl** painted the picture.

2. He tied up the dog. **The dog** bit the postman yesterday.

He tied up the dog **which** bit the postman yesterday.

3. They want to see the farmer. **The farmer** has lost his cows.

They want to see the farmer **who** has lost his cows.

4. Is this the box? You were looking for **this box**.

Is this the box **which** you were looking for this box?

5. What is the name of the boy? **He** is wearing a red cap.

What is the name of the boy **who** is wearing a red cap.

6. He bought the knife. **The knife** had a carved handle.

He bought the knife **which** had a carved handle.

7. They sold the house. **The house** was near the seaside.

They sold the house **which** was near the seaside.

8. Here comes the bus. We are waiting for **it**.

9. The men have killed the snake. **The snake** ate the chickens.

The men have killed the snake **which** ate the chickens.

10. They have eaten all the cakes. Mrs Chong baked **the cakes**.

They have eaten all the cakes **which** Mrs Chong baked.

● EXERCISE 110 - JOINING SENTENCES WITH WHO' / 'WHICH'

Join these pairs of sentences using 'who' or 'which'. You must leave out the words in bold.

e.g. The bird has flown away. **The bird** could sing.

The bird **which** could sing has flown away.

1. The box is here. You were looking for **the box**.

2. The tree has fallen. We planted **it** last year.
The tree **which** we planted last year has fallen.
3. The picture won the first prize. His brother painted **it**.
The picture **which** his brother painted won the first prize.
4. The child is sleeping. **The child** cried just now.
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5. The dress is too tight. You sewed **the dress**.
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6. The girl knows my brother. **The girl** told us the news.
The girl **who** told us the news knows my brother.
7. The boys have fallen ill. They ate the mushrooms.
The boys **who** ate the mushrooms have fallen ill.
8. The children have left. **They** were playing in the field.
The children **who** were playing in the field have left.
9. The book is the thickest on the shelf. You are holding **the book**.
The book **which** you are holding is the thickest on the shelf.
10. Did you talk to the lady? The lady brought **the parcel**.
Did you talk to the lady **who** brought the parcel?

● EXERCISE 111 - JOINING SENTENCES WITH 'WHOSE'

Join these sentences using 'whose'. You must leave out the words **in bold**.

e.g. Is that the man? **His** son is a soldier.

Is that the man **whose** son is a soldier?

1. This is the girl. **Her** sister is your classmate.
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2. She knows the boy. **His** brother is studying in Australia.
She knows the boy **whose** brother is studying in Australia.
5. I went to see the man. **His** son is an artist.
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6. Did you see the lady? **Her** jewels were stolen.
Did you see the lady **whose** jewels were stolen?
9. This is the woman. **The woman's** house caught fire.
This is the woman **whose** house caught fire.
