

Past Continuous vs. Simple Past

Past Continuous

- We use the past continuous to talk about an action in progress in the past.

Form: was / were + verb + -ing

Examples:

- I **was having** lunch.
- She **was driving** to the airport.
- They **were watching** TV.

Simple Past

- We use the simple past for a short action or an action that interrupts another action.

Form: subject + verb in past (-ed/irregular)

Examples:

- I **spilled** coffee on my clothes.
- He **got** a flat tire.
- A celebrity **walked** into the store.

Using Both Together: We often use past continuous + simple past in the **same sentence**.

Structures:

- Past continuous + **when** + simple past = I **was having** lunch **when** I **spilled** coffee.
- **While** + past continuous, simple past = **While** I **was shopping**, a celebrity **walked** into the store

A Busy Day

One morning, Daniel **was getting** ready for work. While he **was going** to answer the phone, the bath **was filling** with water. He **didn't notice**, and the water **overflowed** onto the floor.

At lunchtime, he **was waiting** for the elevator at work. While he **was going** down, the elevator **stopped** and the alarm **went on**. He **sat down** while **waiting** for help.

In the evening, the man **was riding** his bicycle through the city.

While he **was crossing** the street, the traffic light **turned** red, and a car **stopped** suddenly and hit him. Fortunately, he **was** ok but his bicycle **got** damaged.
