

Difference Between Quite and Quiet Quiz

Although **quite** and **quiet** look similar, they have different meanings and pronunciation.

◆ 1. QUITE

Meaning: very / completely / fairly (depending on context)

It is an **adverb** and modifies adjectives or adverbs.

Examples:

- The movie was **quite** interesting. (= very interesting)
- She is **quite** tired.
- The test was **quite** easy.

👉 Pronunciation: /kwait/ (sounds like *kwait*)

◆ 2. QUIET

Meaning: silent / not noisy / calm

It is usually an **adjective**.

Examples:

- Please be **quiet**.
- The classroom is very **quiet**.
- She is a **quiet** person.

👉 Pronunciation: /'kwaɪət/ (sounds like *kwai-et*, two syllables)

🔍 Quick Comparison

Word	Type	Meaning	Example
Quite	Adverb	Very / fairly	It's quite cold.
Quiet	Adjective	Not noisy	It's quiet here.
