

Parallel structure in a writing

Parallel structure means using the same pattern of words to show that two or more ideas have the same level of importance. This can happen at the word, phrase, or clause level. The usual way to join parallel structures is with the use of coordinating conjunctions such as and or or. **Example:**

Parallel: Mary likes hiking, swimming, and riding a bicycle.	Parallel: I think I'll take a long nap, go fishing, or swim in the river.
Not Parallel: Mary likes hiking, swimming, and to ride a bicycle.	Not Parallel: I think I'll take a long nap, go fishing, or swimming in the river.
