Narrative Tenses

We use different past tenses to tell stories.

Past Simple

Use it for:

- **Finished** actions in the past
- **Main** events in a story

Examples:

I **went to** a party last night.

She **met** a famous singer.

They **watched** a movie.

Past Continuous

Use it for:

- Actions in **progress** in the past
- **Background** actions
- An action **interrupted** by another action

Examples:

I **was walking** home.

She **was talking** when the phone rang.

- An action that happened **before** another past action

Examples:

I **had finished** my homework before dinner.

She **had left** when I arrived.

Past Perfect

Use it for:

Storytelling Adverbs

These adverbs make stories more interesting!

P Positive (P) - luckily - fortunately - miraculously	N Negative (N) - sadly - unfortunately	E Neutral/ Surprise (E) - suddenly - surprisingly - unexpectedly - strangely - coincidentally
