However, change slowly began to take place as more international tournaments kicked off and attracted global attention.

Wilma Rudolph was one of the athletes who challenged this system. As a child, she suffered from a serious illness that partially paralysed her left leg. Doctors believed she might never walk normally again. Nevertheless, through extraordinary willpower and years of treatment, she managed to mend her physical condition and eventually learned to run competitively.

At school, a coach noticed her potential and decided to recruit her for the athletics team. Later, she was formally inducted into a national training programme, where she trained intensely for international

events. Before reaching the Olympic final, she had already survived a demanding qualifying round and a tense semi-final. In the final race, thousands of spectators filled the stadium, watching what many described as an action-packed competition. Despite strong opponents, Wilma managed to see off her rivals and win gold medals.

Her victories did more than bring sporting success. They helped challenge racial divides and demonstrated that resilience and talent were more powerful than prejudice.
