


Loy Krathong Festival

Loy krathong is one of the most ^{เป็นที่นิยม} popular festivals in Thailand. It is in November on the night of full moon. It is ^{เฉลิมฉลอง} celebrated to give thanks to the ^{เทพี} goddess of water or Phra Mae Khongkha.

The Krathongs are made of banana tree trunks and banana leaves in many shapes. We put flowers, candles, joss sticks and coins on the Krathongs. Then we ^{ลอย} float the Krathongs on the river or the canals for ^{การยกโทษ} forgiveness for the bad things that we have done to them. We also give thanks to the water because we use it for our living. We ^{เชื่อว่า} believe that the Krathongs will take our ^{ความผิดบาป} sins away.
