

PAST MODALS: SHOULD HAVE / WOULD HAVE

We use **SHOULD HAVE + past participle** to give advice or opinions about the past.

Structure: Subject + should have + past participle

Example:

- You **should have studied** more.
- You **shouldn't have lied** to her friend.



You should have studied more.

We use **WOULD HAVE + past participle** to talk about hypothetical or imaginary past situations.

Structure: Subject + would have + past participle

Example:

- I **would have called** you.
- I **wouldn't have gone** to the party.



I wouldn't have gone to the party.

- What **would you have done**?
