Australian Jessica Watson had a very different childhood from most other children. When she was a child, her family decided to live on a boat for five years.

become well educated, she and her brothers and sisters were taught by their mother.

From the age of 12, Jessica wanted to sail around the world by herself. do this, no-one would be able to help her on the journey, except by radio. Surprisingly her parents supported her, and when she was 16, they started to help her prepare.

she could get experience, she worked on other boats.

She set off from Sydney on 18th October 2009. Her boat, Ella's Pink Lady, was able to sail itself, Jessica could sleep at night. keep the boat in good condition, she had to do all the repairs herself. Jessica expected the journey to take eight months and to travel 23,000 miles. it could be recognised as an official round-the-world voyage, she had to cross the equator and travel 21,600 miles.

Jessica arrived back in Australia seven months later. When she arrived her parents were waiting for her in the harbour they could welcome her home. Her voyage was not recognised as an official record, but it was still an amazing thing to do.
