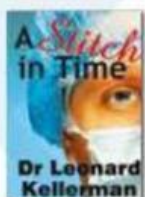

of novels. He can't see the point of reading about made-up characters. He believes that reading should educate people.

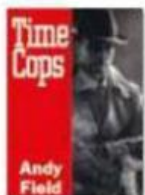

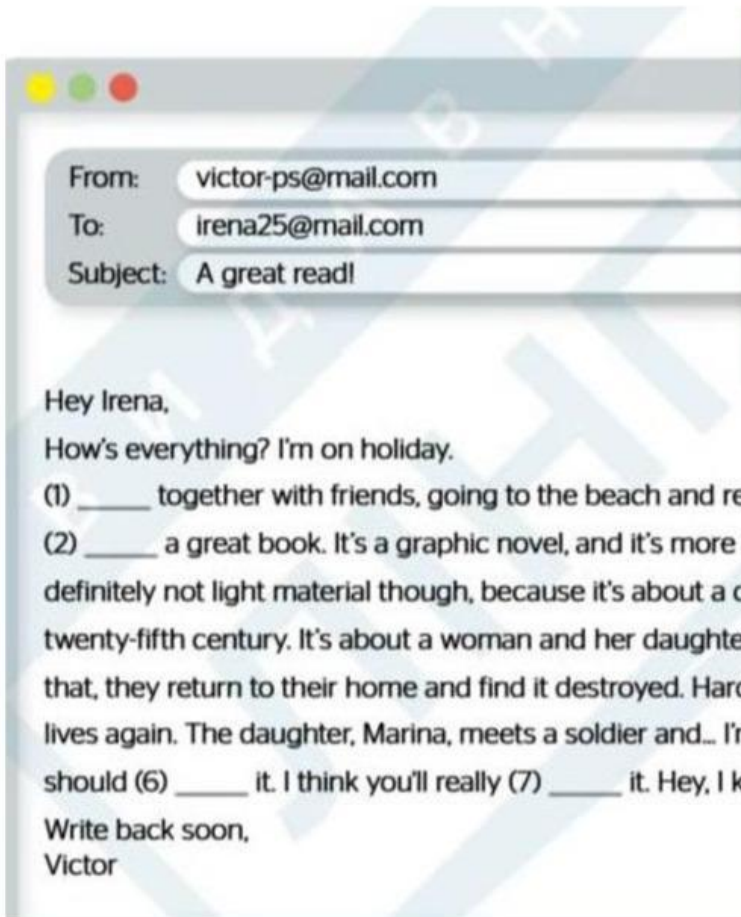
