Quick Tip:

- Use **Gerunds** (-ing) after prepositions and specific verbs like *enjoy, finish, keep, mind, avoid, suggest*.
- Use **Infinitives** (to...) after adjectives and verbs like *want, decide, need, hope, promise, plan, intend*.
