

There is / There are

We use **There is**:

- when we talk about one person, one thing, or one place.
- There is a sofa in the living room.
- There is a book on the table.

We use **There are**:

- when we talk about two or more people, things, or places.
- There are three chairs in the kitchen.
- There are twenty students in the classroom.

Grammar Focus

Comparative Adjectives

■ We use comparative adjectives to compare two people, places, or things.

1. Short Adjectives (one syllable)

Rule: Add -er to the adjective.

- small → smaller
- quiet → quieter

2. Adjectives Ending in -e

Rule: Add -r.

- large → larger
- nice → nicer

3. Adjectives Ending in -y

Rule: Change -y to -ier.

- happy → happier
- busy → busier

4. Long Adjectives (two or more syllables)

Rule: Use more + adjective.

- modern → more modern
- comfortable → more comfortable

5. Irregular Adjectives

Some adjectives change completely.

- good → better
- bad → worse

Examples

- The balcony is wider than the corridor.
- The museum is busier than the art gallery.
- The living room is brighter than the bedroom.
- The sofa is more comfortable than the armchair.
