Tenses: In grammar the word **Tenses** refers to the **Time** when something happens.

When things happen at different times we change the verb to indicate when something happened like the word “eat” being changed into the word “ate”.

There are **Four** basic kinds of **Tenses**:

The Simple Tense: Used for everyday occurrences

The Progressive Tense: Used for a process that takes a while

The Perfect Tense: Used when one thing happens before another

The Perfect Progressive Tense: Used when one process happens before another

Each Tense has three Variations **Past, Future and Present**.

The Simple Past Tense:

Exam Question 1: When do we use the Simple Past?

Exam Answer 1: When something happened at a specific time in the past.

Example: Yesterday, I ate lunch.

Exam Question 2: What happens to the verb in the Simple Past?

Exam Answer 2: The verb is changed into the past participle form.

Examples: “Eat” becomes “Ate”, Walk becomes “Walked”, “Drink” becomes “Drank”.

Time words: Yesterday, Last (Week/Month/Year), [Any date in the past].

The Simple Present Tense

Exam Question 3: When do we use the Simple Present Tense?

Exam Answer 3: We use the Simple Present Tense when something happens every day or in the usual way or when something just happens to be true.

Example: I play games on my smartphone every day. (Everyday)

Example: The sun is hot. (True)

Exam Question 4: What happens to the verb in the Simple Present?

Exam Answer 4: Nothing- we use the base form of the verb for the Simple Present Tense.

Example: “Eat” stays “Eat”, “Walk” stays “Walk”, “drink” stays “Drink”

The Simple Future Tense:

Exam Question 4: When do we use the Simple Future Tense?

Exam Answer 4: We use the Simple Future Tense to make a prediction or give a warning, or when we make a spontaneous (on the spot)decision.

Exam Question 5: What happens to the verb in the Simple Future Tense?

Exam Answer 5: In the Simple Future Tense we add the word “Will” in front of the base form of the verb.

Example: “Walk” becomes “will walk”, “eat” becomes “will eat”, “drink” becomes “will drink”

Time Words: tomorrow, next week, on [any future date], in [x] (days, weeks, months, years), the day after tomorrow.
