

Complex object + infinitive

1. After verbs that express mental activity (opinion, assumption, expectation): *analyse, assume, believe, convince, discover, expect, find, find out, imagine, know, prove, suppose, think, trust, etc.*

Some friends **believe her to be** selfish for not wanting kids.

2. After verbs expressing desire or need: *desire, want, wish, like, should like, would like.*

Despite the pressure, they **would like their friends and family to respect** their choice.

Complex object + bare infinitive

1. After verbs of perception: *see, feel, hear, observe, notice, watch.*

Did you **notice this family struggle** with societal expectations, yet still, they persist?

Note

We can also use a **gerund** to show an active action is progress.

I heard them **discussing** their child-free lifestyle with confidence.

2. After verbs of order, permission: *make, let, help.*

She **let them be** child-free without imposing her own beliefs on them.

Complex object + gerund

1. After the following verbs: *dislike, hate, imagine, involve, keep, mind, prevent, remember, risk, stop.*

Many people **hate their friends reminding** them about the "biological clock."
