

Comparatives of Clothes

Clothing Adjectives

Size & Fit: big / small, long / short, tight / loose

Price: cheap / expensive

Style: fashionable / unfashionable, modern / old-fashioned, casual / formal

Comfort: comfortable / uncomfortable

Material & Quality: soft / hard, light / heavy, thick / thin, warm / cool

Color & Appearance: bright / dark, colorful / plain



Grammar: Comparatives

We use comparatives to compare two things.

Structure: Subject + verb + comparative adjective + than + object

Example: This jacket is warmer than that one.

Rules:

1. **Short adjectives:** add -er (small → smaller, long → longer)
2. **Adjectives ending in -y:** change y → ier (heavy → heavier)
3. **Long adjectives:** use more (more comfortable, more expensive)
4. **Irregular:** good → better, bad → worse
