

# Listening Worksheet: Ellipsis in Hey Ya!

Task: Listen to the song and choose what is implied but not fully said.

**Lyric / Context:** Hey ya! (repeated hook)

**Question:**

A. He is greeting someone politely B. He is introducing a story in detail C. He is showing a strong emotion without fully explaining it D. He is giving a formal instruction

**Lyric / Context:** You think you got it

**Question:**

A. Everything is going perfectly B. He believes the other person is missing something important C. He is asking for help D. He is describing a finished event

**Lyric / Context:** Shake it like a Polaroid picture

**Question:**

A. It is a playful command where some words are left out B. It is advice about saving memories carefully C. It is a literal instruction about photography D. It is describing a slow process

**Lyric / Context:** Alright alright alright

**Question:**

A. He is listing instructions step-by-step B. He is repeating words instead of giving a full explanation C. He is ending the conversation clearly D. He is correcting a mistake

**Lyric / Context:** What's cooler than being cool?

**Question:**

A. He is asking a question that expects a real answer B. The answer is already implied, not said C. He is comparing two real objects D. He is talking about temperature

**Lyric / Context:** Don't want to...

**Question:**

A. He stops early because the rest is understood B. He is listing several actions clearly C. He is repeating a full refusal D. The sentence is complete as it is

**Lyric / Context:** Repeated Hey ya! sections

**Question:**

A. Each line is a full sentence B. It has no meaning at all C. The meaning is understood even without full sentences D. It is only a formal greeting

**Lyric / Context:** Fast conversational lines in verses

**Question:**

A. The lyrics are random and disconnected B. Everything is fully explained C. It is written like an essay D. Some words are left out because it sounds natural in speech
