

Mastering the Present Continuous

The **Present Continuous** is used to describe actions happening **right now** or around the current moment. It is formed using the verb *to be* (**am, is, are**) and the main verb ending in **-ing**.

Part 1: Affirmative Sentences

Structure: Subject + am/is/are + verb-ing
