"World Englishes" is a term that describes the different varieties of English spoken globally. To better understand these varieties, we can use the model of concentric circles, which was **proposed** by linguist Braj Kachru. At the center of this model is standard English, spoken in countries such as the UK and the US. The first outer circle contains countries where English is the second language, like India and Nigeria. The second outer circle includes countries where English is taught as a foreign language, such as China and Brazil. These outer circles reflect the **distinct** variations of English that have developed over time.

English is now an official language in more than 50 countries, and each of these nations has developed its own version of the language. These versions are not simply copies of British or American English, but instead feature unique vocabulary and phrases. In some cases, English has incorporated words from local languages. For instance, in Singapore, English has borrowed Malay words like "kopi" (coffee), and in India, English includes several terms from Hindi, such as "guru" (teacher).

Immigrants to English-speaking countries often speak both English and their native language. Before they arrive in their new country, many join classes to learn English. Once there, **they** continue to improve their English skills through interaction with native speakers.
