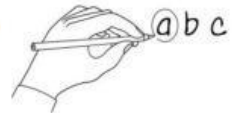

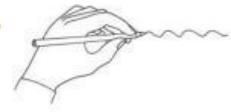
An arrow points from the 'Hello!' speech bubble to the 'English' box in the second row.
