Instructions:

1. Fill 1/4 of the glass with water.
2. Pour in the vegetable oil until the glass is almost full.
3. Add a few drops of food coloring.
4. Drop in a fizzy tablet.
5. Watch your lava lamp work!

**How it works:**

The oil floats because it is lighter than water. The food coloring weighs the same as water, so it mixes with the water. The fizzy tablet produces gas. Gas is lighter than water, so it floats to the top, taking a little colored water with it. When the gas comes out, the water becomes heavier again and sinks. For extra fun, add more tablets, or light up the glass with a flashlight!
