Green tourism, also called sustainable tourism, is a way of traveling that protects the environment and helps local communities. More travelers today want to enjoy beautiful places without causing harm to nature or local people.

Traditional tourism can damage the environment in many ways. Popular tourist destinations often face problems like pollution, too much garbage, and **depleted** natural resources such as water and energy. Hotels and restaurants use large amounts of electricity and produce waste. When too many visitors come to one place, they can destroy forests, beaches, and wildlife habitats. Local people may also lose their traditional way of life.

Green tourism offers better solutions. Eco-friendly hotels use solar power and save water. Tourists can choose activities that don't harm animals or plants, like bird watching or hiking on marked trails.
