Direct: He says, "I love you."

Indirect: He says (that) he loves me.

Direct: She said, "I drink milk."

Indirect: She said (that) she drank milk.

Direct : Tony begged, "Please move into the living room."

Indirect: Tony begged me to move into the living room.

Direct: She said to me, "Can you sing a song?"

Indirect: She asked me if I could sing a song.

Direct: The doctor said, "Don't smoke."

Indirect: The doctor advised me not to smoke.

Direct: He said to her, "What are you doing now?"

Indirect: He asked her what she was doing then.
