

Let's Go to the Concert

Lucas: Hi, Anna! I'm good, thanks. And you?

Anna: I'm great!

Anna: Hey, do you like rock music?

Lucas: Yes, I do! I love it.

Anna: Do you like concerts?

Lucas: Yes, I do! I love them, but I don't go very often.

Anna: Really? Would you like to go to a Maroon Five concert this Saturday?

Lucas: Yes, I'd love to! What time is it?

Anna: It's at 7:00 p.m. at the city park.

Lucas: That sounds great!



Lucas: Would you like to eat something before the concert?

Anna: I'd love to, but I have to help my mom at home.

Lucas: Oh, okay. No problem! What about going to a pizza restaurant after the concert?

Anna: I'd like to, but I need to go home early.

Lucas: That's okay. Maybe another day!

Anna: Yes, maybe next time!

Invitations

- We use "**Would you like to...?**" To invite someone to do something

Accepting:

Yes, I would. / I'd love to. / Sure!

Refusing:

I'd like to, but I have to/want to/need to

Be careful!

Do you like...? (General preference): We use "Do you like...?" to talk about things in general.

It means: Is this good for you? Is this your preference?

Example: Do you like to go to concerts? - Yes, I do/No, I don't.

Would you like...? (Offer or invitation): We use "Would you like...?" to offer or invite someone.

It means: Do you want this?

Example: Would you like to eat some pizza? - Yes, I'd like to.
