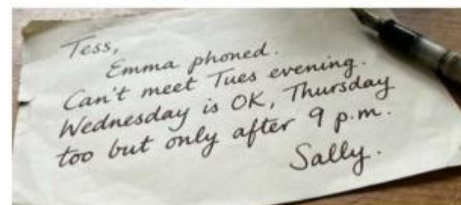

More and more people are moving from the countryside to cities. This process, called urbanization, is happening very quickly in many parts of the world. Today, over half of the world's population lives in urban areas, and this number continues to grow every year.

People move to cities for different reasons. Cities offer better job opportunities and higher salaries than rural areas. They also have more schools, hospitals, and entertainment options. Young people especially are attracted to the **vibrant** city lifestyle with its modern shops, restaurants, and cultural activities. Many believe that living in a city will give them and their children a better future.

However, rapid urbanization creates serious problems. Cities become overcrowded, and housing becomes expensive. Traffic jams waste people's time and pollute the air. Some neighborhoods lack clean water and proper waste management systems. Poor people often live in slums without basic services like electricity or healthcare.

Despite these challenges, urbanization is not going to stop. The question is how to manage it better. City planners must **mitigate** the negative effects by building more affordable housing, improving public transportation, and creating green spaces. If cities can develop in a sustainable way, they can provide good living conditions for everyone while protecting the environment.
